 Key caregiver qualities: dependability, compassion, patience, humor, good social skills, honesty, physical strength, and endurance. Caregiving can be stressful and demanding with many challenges. The best caregivers bring

- professionalism, competence and skill to the job.
- Commitment to use HCA training to provide care to individuals and families on Vashon Island.
- For the first year after completing their HCA training and becoming certified, scholarship recipients will be required to commit to work a minimum of 3-5 hours/week with low-income islanders who qualify for state-funded caregiving assistance. (COPES certified clients).
- The scholarship covers tuition for the 75-hour Home Care Aide training course offered on-line by Cornerstone Healthcare Training, as well as state testing and license fees. Recipients will begin the course the week of December 9, 2024 to be completed by March 14, 2024.
- Students are to take their Washington State HCA certification exam and be set up with Consumer Direct Care Network (CDWA) to begin serving COPES clients by April 14, 2024.
